

WEEKLY REPORT

On Thursday, July 8th, at 1:38a.m., Officer Peter Barnes observed a vehicle driven by Delanie Laws, exit parking lot number one without paying for parking services. The vehicle allowed the car in front of it to pay, and then quickly exited the lot before the gate arm closed. Ms. Laws was also not in possession of her vehicle registration and insurance card. She was transported to the Newark Police Department where she was processed and released with a summons.

On Thursday, July 8th, at 1:40 a.m., Cpl. Patrick Craig observed a vehicle driven by Kevin Markle, exit parking lot number one without pay for parking services. He was issued a summons and released.

On Friday, July 9th, at 10:50 p.m., members of the Newark Police Department Street Crime Unit along with a member of the University of Delaware Police Department, who is assigned to the unit, observed a drug transaction involving crack/cocaine. All suspects were arrested.

This week completes the second of three five week training cycles. All officers in the department qualified with firearms and attended classroom training on a variety of subjects. The training began on Tuesday, June 15th and ended on Tuesday, July 13th.

The Newark Police Department has received federal grants for a variety of equipment. This week we should receive the equipment for the security cameras that will be placed downtown in off campus student housing areas. The purpose of installing the cameras is to reduce the chances for students to become victims of crime. We were also awarded a mobile license plate recognition camera. This camera automatically reads each license plate it passes and checks to see if the vehicle is stolen or if the owner is wanted in connection with criminal activity. We are also receiving three vehicle cameras. These cameras will record each motor vehicle stop made by an officer using the equipped police vehicle. The license plate recognition camera and recording cameras will not be installed until the new police vehicles arrive. It is anticipated that the new cars will arrive in the fall.
