

WEEKLY REPORT

01/23-01/29/11

On Monday, January 31st, at 1:25 p.m., Corporal Maurer observed a vehicle travelling on East Delaware Avenue. A computer check of the license plate revealed that the vehicle registration was expired. The officer stopped the vehicle and observed it was occupied by a 21 year old female driver that had a small child in the rear. The driver told the officer she was tired of being stopped by the police. She was issued a summons and began to scream at Corporal Maurer. Using profanity, she yelled that she had no money to pay for tickets and had "another kid on the way". The officer tried to explain how to resolve the summons but was continually cursed at by the driver. After being handed her summonses, the driver threw them out the window. The officer informed the driver he would swear out a traffic warrant for littering. The driver then cursed at the officer and drove off.

The Newark Police Department is investigating an armed robbery that occurred at the Boston Market located at 1050 South College Avenue on Monday, January 31st at 9:58 p.m. In this incident, the suspect entered the store, displayed a black long barrel revolver and demanded cash from the cashier. After receiving an undisclosed amount of cash the suspect then fled the restaurant, entered a vehicle and was last seen turning right out of the parking lot onto southbound South College Avenue towards I-95.

The suspect is described as a black male wearing dark clothing, sunglasses, a knit hat, white gloves and a cloth around his mouth. He was carrying a green duffle bag with white straps.

On Monday, January 31st, a Superior Court Jury convicted Leonard M. Taylor of murder. In May of 2009, Taylor shot Sven Hinds twice in the back of the head and once in the temple in a Newark motel room. The body was later dumped in New Jersey. Newark Detective Fred Nelson was the lead investigator on the case. Law enforcement officials from New Jersey also assisted in the case.

On Tuesday, February 1st, at 10:28 a.m., Officer Martin responded to O'Daniel Avenue, in reference to a report of an attempted theft by deception. The 70 year old resident reported that she received a call on her home phone. A male caller stated he was the residents' grandson. The caller went on to state that he was involved in an accident in Canada and arrested. The suspect requested that the resident send money so he could post bail. The resident, suspecting that the call was a scam, asked the caller what his birthday was. The caller stated, "You know that grandma." The resident again repeated the question and the caller hung up. The resident contacted her grandson, who stated he was not in Canada and was fine.

The inclement weather so far this year has lead to a significant increase in the number of traffic accidents.
