

WEEKLY REPORT

02/06-02/12/11

On Wednesday, February 9th, at 7:30 p.m., officers responded to Kershaw Street on a report of a home invasion robbery. Upon arriving at the scene, officers learned that two males knocked on the door to the home. When the door was opened by the victim, the two males entered the house armed with a handgun. The victim and a roommate were ordered to sit on the couch. One of the suspects struck one of the victims in the face with the handgun. A safe containing \$2,000.00 was stolen. The victim of the stolen safe admitted that he sells drugs from the residence.

On Friday, February 11th, Officer Wolfrom and Corporal Kendrick responded to Pomeroy Station on a report of a suspicious person. Upon arriving at the scene, the officers observed a 21 year-old white male that was naked standing in the hallway. The suspect stated he was in a female's room but got locked out of the apartment. The male was charged with disorderly conduct.

On Friday, February 11th, at 10:39 p.m., Parking Enforcement Officer Pietschmann observed a vehicle parked on Main Street without a registration tag on it. A female exited a business and entered the vehicle. The officer asked the driver for the vehicle registration. The driver refused and began to drive toward the officer. The officer jumped back and the vehicle turned toward him, striking the officer. The incident was radioed into police headquarters and the motorist was stopped and arrested. The incident was recorded on our police surveillance cameras.

On Sunday, February 13th, Corporal Beighley responded to the University of Delaware Health Service Center on a report on an assault in the past. The injured party stated that he attended a party "somewhere" on South College Avenue with a friend. At approximately 1:00 a.m., the victim observed his friend involved in a fight. The victim "jumped in" to assist his friend and was punched in the ear, receiving a laceration. Corporal Beighley responded to the victim's friend's dorm room. The friend/witness stated that he and the victim were at a party on South College Avenue. After consuming 5 shots of alcohol, he went outside to urinate on the side of the house. When the witness attempted to return inside the house, he was told he was not welcome and pushing began. That is when the victim was assaulted. The incident is under investigation.

On Tuesday, February 15th, at 8:47 a.m., officers responded to the TD bank located on Delaware Avenue on a report of a bank robbery. A male approximately 45-55 years of age presented the bank teller with a note stating that he had a gun and demanded money. The teller handed over cash and the suspect left the bank. The robbery is under investigation by Detective Watson.

On Tuesday, February 15th, at 8:04 p.m., officers responded to a report of a home invasion robbery on Scholar Drive. Upon arriving at the scene, Corporal Veron found one of the victims covered in blood and holding a rag to his eye. The victim stated he was in his apartment living room when there was a knock at the front door. The victim opened the door and was “rushed” by three suspects and then struck in the face with a baseball bat. One of the suspects was armed with a handgun and removed money from the victim’s wallet. A safe was also removed from the apartment. The case is being investigated by Detective D’Elia.

On Wednesday, February 16th, the Police Department and Parks Department met for the first time to begin planning for this year’s Newark Nite. Last week, officers from the Traffic Division travelled to Kennett Square, Pennsylvania to discuss how the Kennett Square Mushroom Festival was organized with controlled access.
