SUBJECT: Police Request Assistance Identifying Subjects

The Newark Police Department is investigating a daytime burglary which occurred at the Newark United Church of Christ on March 5th, 2011. Stolen during this burglary were various items including food intended for the homeless and a credit card. The credit card was later used at a Gulf gas station on 4th Street in Wilmington.

As part of this investigation the Newark Police Department is requesting the public's assistance in identifying the two subjects in the attached photographs as well as the owner of the pictured truck.

The first subject is described as a tall, thin, white male in his 30's with brown hair. He is usually in possession of a book bag and a rolling suitcase. He is known to frequent Main Street in Newark and is believed to be homeless.

The second subject is believed to be a light skinned black male. Both were last seen in Wilmington at the Gulf station on 4th Street where they used the stolen credit card to purchase gasoline for the operator of a two-tone Dodge Ram truck with a makeshift bed rack, possibly made of wood.
