

WEEKLY REPORT

05/22-05/28/11

On Monday, May 23, 2011, Officer Spadola responded to a residence on the first block of Madison Drive for a report of a Burglary where copper piping was stolen out of the house. The vacant residence was entered and serious damage was caused to the ceiling and other objects in order to remove copper piping. The damage to the residence is estimated at over \$4,000 and the stolen copper has an estimated value of \$500. There are currently no suspects in this incident.

On Thursday, May 26, 2011, Cpl. Marconi responded to Wooden Wheels in the Newark Shopping Center for a report of a fraudulent purchase of a bicycle with a credit card. On Monday, May 23, 2011, two suspects entered the store and purchased a Cannondale bike and accessories totaling \$1,605.99. It was later determined that the credit card was not valid. Wooden Wheels was able to provide specific times and a description of the vehicle as well as a direction of travel after it left the shopping center. The described suspect vehicle with the bike mounted to the rear of it was capture on the Main Street license plate recognition (LPR) system. The LPR provided a color photograph of the car and a photograph of the license plate. This investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, May 28, 2011, Cpl. Skinner responded to the 100 block of Madison Drive for a report that an unknown suspect entered the rear of the residence and removed copper pipes from inside. It is believed that sometime on Friday night 5/27/2011, while a resident was sleeping; the unknown suspect entered the rear of residence and removed some piping. The estimated value of the stolen pipes is \$100. Damage was caused to the residence and others pipes during the theft. There are currently no suspects in this incident.

On Sunday, May 29, 2011, Cpl. Craig responded to several residences in the neighborhoods off of West Chestnut Hill Road for a report of thefts from unsecured motor vehicles. It was determined that sometime between Saturday afternoon May 28th and Sunday morning May 29th, five victims had their vehicles entered and items were stolen from inside them. The stolen items included; GPS units, money, credit cards, purses, prescription pills and personal identification.
