

WEEKLY REPORT
01/15-01/21/12

On January 20th the Newark Police Department arrested 40 year old John M. Krok of Claymont for one count of Indecent Exposure after he exposed himself on East Main Street to a 21 year female University of Delaware student. On this date at approximately 5:45pm the suspect pulled his vehicle, a Black Mercedes Benz, over onto the shoulder of East Main Street at Academy Street. The suspect then asked the victim, who was walking on the sidewalk, for directions. When the victim looked into the vehicle she observed that the suspect was exposing his genitalia. The victim then walked away from the vehicle which pulled away westbound on East Main Street. The victim then reported the incident to Newark Police. Several hours later, at 8:00pm an officer on patrol observed the suspect vehicle, again travelling on East Main Street and initiated a traffic stop. The driver was taken into custody for questioning and was positively identified by the victim. Arrested was John M. Krok DOB 12/27/1971 of 128 S Shelley Drive Claymont, DE 19703. He was charged with 1 Count Indecent Exposure 2nd Degree and released on \$250 unsecured bond.

On January 21st the Newark Police were called to investigate 12 weekend incidents of theft from unsecured vehicles, sheds and yards in the community of Nottingham Green. In all instances, entry was gained through unsecured shed or vehicle doors. After gaining entry, the suspect(s) removed items including a power generator, snow blower, gasoline, hunting equipment, several wallets, a digital camera, CD's and loose change. In total over \$6,000 in property was stolen. The thefts occurred in the overnight hours from Friday 1/20/12 into Saturday 1/21/12. Locations of occurrences were: Bent Lane, Colgate Lane, Radcliffe Drive, and Harvard Lane. There are no known suspects at this time.

On January 24th at approximately 11:09 p.m., Officer Mullin responded to a report of a hit and run driver that was followed into the Suburban Plaza Shopping Center by the operator of the vehicle that had been struck. The operator observed the suspect enter into the Acme. The operator was on the phone with the Newark 911 center as the suspect exited the Acme and returned to the vehicle. As the suspect was driving through the parking lot, Officer Mullin arrived and was directed to the suspect vehicle by the other party. Officer Mullin activated his overhead lights and attempted to stop the vehicle in the parking lot; however the suspect refused to stop and continued to drive around the parking lot at a speed of approximately 20 mph. Other officers arrived to the main entrance of the shopping center, as the suspect vehicle re-entered Suburban Plaza. The suspect then stopped his vehicle and was taken into custody. The defendant was identified as Leonard K. Baylis DOB 9/5/1950 of 186 North Dupont Highway New Castle, DE 19720. Baylis was found to be driving a stolen vehicle and was DUI. He was charged with the following: Receiving Stolen Property, Disregarding a Police Officer Signal, Resisting Arrest, 4th offense DUI – Alcohol, Driving While Suspended, Display Fictitious Registration, Leave the Scene of a Collision and Fail to Follow Turn Lane.
