SUBJECT: Traffic Stop Leads to Arrest of Second Suspect Involved in Two Robberies

On Tuesday, July 9th, 2013 at approximately 12:30 p.m., a member of Newark Police Department's Traffic Unit conducted a motor vehicle stop on a 1999 Ford F250 for a speeding violation. The driver was identified as Clay Mcinnis. Mcinnis was previously identified by NPD detectives as the second suspect in the May 13th, 2013 robbery of a PNC Bank ATM patron, as well as the May 17th, 2013 robbery of Domino's Pizza involving two separate victims. NPD had attempted to locate Mcinnis several times without success.

Due to Mcinnis's active warrants, he was taken into custody by NPD without incident. His vehicle was towed back to NPD headquarters and a search warrant was executed on it. Detectives seized 203 grams of marijuana, 1 gram of crack cocaine and 13 opiate pills from the vehicle.

He was incarcerated at Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$173,500 cash bail.

1 count of Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
