SUBJECT: NPD Announce Arrest of One of Two Criminal Mischief Suspects

On September 12th, 2013, NPD sent out a press release containing pictures of two criminal mischief suspects that damaged the roof of a Ford Mustang during the disorderly crowd incident of September 10th, 2013. John Marine, after seeing the press release online, turned himself in to NPD to face charges. Marine is a University of Delaware student.

Newark, DE 19711**

**Charges: Riot
Criminal Mischief Under \$1,000
Disorderly Conduct by Obstructing Vehicular or Pedestrian Traffic**

Marine was released on \$1,700 unsecured bond.

Detectives are actively identifying leads to determine the identity of the second suspect.



SUBJECT: NPD Seeks Public's Assistance in Identifying Two Criminal Mischief Suspects



On 09/09/13 around 23:28 hours, the Newark Police Department responded to a large disorderly party in the 400 block of S. College Avenue Newark DE 19711. Upon the arrival of police, subjects dispersed from the party traveling northbound along S. College Avenue to E. Main Street. Once on E. Main Street subjects were walking in the roadway blocking vehicular traffic and banging/jumping on vehicles. The above two suspects jumped on top of a Ford Mustang causing
