Chief Tiernan attended the city council meeting along with representatives from the University of Delaware and the University Police Department. Council was briefed on the large crowd event that occurred on September 9th. Council invited the university representatives to return to a future meeting provide an update on the Wellspring project.

On Thursday, September 26th, the Newark Police Department received several hundred emergency preparedness brochures from New Castle County. These brochures are available in the city hall lobby and are intended to educate the public on how to deal with specific emergency conditions that may arise.

Even though all of the prizes have been won, children are welcome to stop by the police station to meet the officers and collect their card.

Newark Police have arrested a 19 year old Newark man and are searching for a second male following a theft of eighteen (18) air conditioning units from a business in the 700 block of Interchange Boulevard in Newark on September 18th.

On this date, at approximately 11:00 p.m., NPD officers responded to the business for a report of a theft in progress. Upon arrival officers discovered that unknown subjects had cut a fence, gaining access to a storage yard, and once inside, stole eighteen (18) scrap air conditioning units. Officers quickly developed information which led them to a home located at 20 Merion Road in Chestnut Hill Estates. Officers responded to that location and located 19 year old Adam Roper in possession of the units. Roper was taken into custody without incident.

A second male, 37 year old Ernest Lapointe fled the scene upon police arrival. Police have obtained arrest warrants for Lapointe and are actively searching for him. Lapointe has does not have a local address, however he is known to frequent area hotels.
