

WEEKLY REPORT

Our crime statistics continue to show a drastic decrease in crime. We are on pace to have the lowest number of robberies in 8 years. Assault, burglary, and thefts all show significant decreases.

On October 28, 2013, the City Council voted to amend Chapter 19 of the city's ordinances. The amendment authorizes immunity for persons who report an alcohol overdose, drug overdose or other life threatening emergency. Immunity is granted if the person seeking medical attention reports the emergency to law enforcement, the 911 system, a poison control center, to a medical provider (or is assisting someone reporting such an emergency). In order for the person not to be charged, the person must provide all relevant medical information as to the cause of the overdose or emergency to the responding authorities or medical providers. This statute applies to the individual suffering the overdose, the person reporting the overdose, and anyone assisting either party. **This ordinance makes Newark city code compliant with Delaware State law.**

The traffic control for the Halloween parade went very smoothly. There was a very large turnout for an excellent parade. The police department is planning for the upcoming Turkey Trot and Winterfest.

On Saturday, October 26, 2013, members of the police department assisted Deputy City Manager Andrew Haines in administering the written exam to candidates for the position of police officer. The next step in the testing process is the oral interview with the candidates, followed by the physical agility test.
