On Thursday, February 20th, Captain John Potts received recognition from the New Castle County Emergency Medical Services at a ceremony at NCCPD Headquarters. Captain Potts received a certificate of appreciation for his “outstanding contribution and exemplary service to the field of pre-hospital emergency medical care” to a severely injured motorist at a motor vehicle crash on I-95 on December 27th. This care allowed paramedics to temporarily restore the victim’s pulse while enroute to the hospital.

Victim Services Coordinator Susan Alfree, who is the Chairperson of the Annual Victims’ Tribute Planning Committee, spent Thursday, February 20th with her counterpart at Wilmington Police Department planning this year’s tribute. Together they created flyers, contacted vendors and news outlets for advertising and coordinated speaking arrangements with the key note speaker. The tribute is planned for Wednesday, April 9th at Delaware State University.

On Friday, February 21st, M/Cpl. Gerald Bryda participated in a mock CALEA Assessment for the Middletown Police Department. Middletown PD is seeking their initial Accreditation which Newark Police has been a part of since 1997.

On Friday, February 21st, the patrol division investigated a report of theft of 25-30 boxes of copper and brass fittings from a construction trailer located in Suburban Plaza. The thefts were reported to have occurred between February 14th and 16th. The fittings are valued at approximately \$26,000.

On February 21st, Animal Control Officer Donna Vickers received certification from the National Wildlife Control Training Program – Delaware, allowing her to remain in compliance with state law regarding trapping and releasing wild animals. This certification required extensive study and successful completion of a written examination.

Patricia DiEmidio, Training Coordinator and Sally Reutter, Property Coordinator spent a significant portion of the week coordinating final arrangements and equipment allocation for recruits Nate Graber and Adam Heath to attend the DSP Training Academy beginning on Monday, February 24th. Additionally, Mrs. DiEmidio worked on finalization of the Annual Training Summary for submission to the Council on Police Training. This report summarized all training for every sworn police officer within the Newark Police Department.
