City Manager Carol Houck, Councilmember Marge Hadden, and Chief Tiernan have been working on a railroad safety presentation for the residents of Newark. The meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, April 17th at 6:30 p.m. The session will be held at Aetna Fire Station 8, located at 400 Ogletown Road, Newark. The Newark Police Department will explain the city's Emergency Operation Plan as it relates to railroad safety. The police department will also outline the responsibilities of the Newark communication center and the duties of the police department at such an event. The Aetna Fire Chief will outline the fire departments role in railroad emergency's and the chief's role as the "Incident Commander" as required by Delaware law. The New Castle County Office of Emergency Management will outline their role in coordinating with such agencies as the Red Cross, as well as State and Federal responders. Additional speakers from DelDOT and the railroad will also present. A press release is expected to be sent out on Monday, March 31st.

On Monday, March 24th, M/Cpl Paul Keld and Corporal Adam Stevens were presented with "Officer of the Quarter" awards from the Knights of Columbus. M/Cpl Keld was awarded for his work in solving the hit and run accident death of a 76 year old female, as well as wrestling a knife away from man in a separate incident. Cpl. Stevens was awarded for his work as a patrol officer who conducted a drug investigation which resulted in the arrest of the suspected drug dealer and the seizure of 4.5 pounds of marijuana, as well as ecstasy, cocaine and \$10,000 in cash.

We have been short staffed due to retirements and officers out on sick leave or working light duty. With the return of the students, we have been very busy the last few weeks. Officers have been handling the usual calls of alcohol and drug overdoses, assaults, burglary, thefts, robbery, fights, loud parties, etc. This has resulted in a delayed response to some calls.
