**Newark, DE** (May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2014) - The University of Delaware and the City of Newark have joined forces once again to offer the eighth consecutive year of the "UDon't Need It?" student move-out program now at its new location at University of Delaware's STAR Campus at 540 South College Avenue. The program was originally developed to take control of the overwhelming amount of household goods disposed of each spring by departing university students.

Goodwill Industries of DE will receive needed items. Remaining items are then sold to the general public at great prices!

Unopened, non-perishable foods will be donated to the Food Bank of Delaware.

Household trash and unusable items are disposed of, keeping them off of our streets and sidewalks.

The program will start accepting student deliveries on May 21<sup>st</sup>. Sale of items are slated for June 4<sup>th</sup> through June 7<sup>th</sup>.

Newark Public Works and Water Resources Director Tom Coleman says, "We have been very successful at reducing the amount of re-usable items that end up in the landfill. This program exemplifies the great work Newark and the University can do together for the good of the overall community."

Partnering and supporting organizations include The Food Bank of Delaware, Goodwill Industries of Delaware, and Clean Harbors.
