On June 17th, Chief Tiernan, Lt. Feeney, Sgt. VanCampen, and Cpl. Spadola attended a community meeting with residents of White Chapel and Fountainview. The meeting was organized by Councilman Todd Ruckle. Over eighty (80) residents attended the meeting. Cpl. Spadola outlined prior calls for service in those neighborhoods, and provided crime prevention information. All officers gave presentations about their respective area of the police department and answered questions from the audience. The residents expressed their pleasure with the police department and several members of the audience shared specific experiences of the police responding quickly and professionally to their calls.

On June 19th, Chief Tiernan, Lieutenant Feeney, and Lieutenant Farrall joined City Manager Carol Houck and Deputy City Manager Andrew Haines at a training seminar entitled, "The New Normal in Policing". Mr. Haines discovered this valuable seminar and organized our attendance. The police department personnel order and assignments for Newark's "New Night Downtown" is in place. A large number of officers will be working on traffic control and safety.

Newark Police are investigating two separate incidents involving a suspicious vehicle. On June 13th at approximately 9:30 a.m., an 18 year-old female was walking in the 600 block of Dallam Road. She observed a white work van with ladders on top parked on the street. As she walked past, the vehicle turned around in a driveway and drove up to her. The driver asked her if she wanted a ride. She ignored the driver and the vehicle continued driving on Dallam Road and left the area. The female described the vehicle as being occupied by two Hispanic males.

On June 13th at approximately 8:16 p.m., a 9 year-old female reported that a white mini-van slowed down as it drove past her on Dallas Avenue near Beverly Road. The vehicle then made a U-turn a short distance ahead and again drove past her at a slow rate of speed. The vehicle was described as a bright white mini-van with dark windows, possibly with a roof rack.
