

## WEEKLY REPORT

The Fall Crime Suppression Plan continues and officers are busy, particularly on the weekends. On September 13<sup>th</sup>, officers responded to a report of an intoxicated male at the Main Street Galleria. The male subject was being treated by Aetna medics and transported to Christiana Hospital for evaluation. During the early morning hours of September 19, officers responded to a male subject passed out in front of 102 E. Main Street. The subject was transported to Christiana Hospital for evaluation. Shortly after, officers responded for a report of a female subject unconscious in the parking lot located at 38 E. Main Street. Friends of the subject advised officers that she had consumed a large amount of alcohol. The subject was transported to Christiana Hospital for evaluation.

On September 12<sup>th</sup>, the Newark Police Department in partnership with the U.S Drug Enforcement Administration held a prescription Drug Takeback event. The event was a success and yielded 503 pounds of prescription medication. The medications were turned over to the D.E.A and will be destroyed.

On September 14<sup>th</sup>, four Newark Police recruits started the Delaware State Police Academy which runs through February 2016. We welcome them to the Newark Police ranks and wish them all the best of luck.

On September 15<sup>th</sup>, officers responded to the unit block of Westfield Drive for a shots fired complaint. Officers discovered that a suspect fired seven rounds into an unoccupied, parked vehicle. The Criminal Investigations Division is investigating.

On September 18<sup>th</sup>, officers responded to the Fulton Bank on E. Main Street for a robbery. The Criminal Investigations Division is investigating.

On September 18<sup>th</sup>, officers responded to the area of Marrows Road and Wyoming Road for a report of a robbery. The victim stated that he was approached and robbed by four subjects as he walked along Marrows Road. Newark Police were assisted by officers from the University of Delaware Police and the New Castle County Police. All four subjects were apprehended and charged with various crimes related to the incident.

Lt. Hargrove received an email from a citizen thanking Cpl. Darryl Saunders for going above and beyond to assist her juvenile stepson over the weekend. The citizen complimented Cpl. Saunders on his ability to take command of the situation. She related that Cpl. Saunders kept her stepson "calm and at ease, in an otherwise tense and scary situation."
