

WEEKLY REPORT

Preparations have been made for the next two weekends in anticipation of Saint Patrick's Day celebrations. We are aware of celebration activities taking place both the weekend of the 11th and the following weekend. Extra officers will be on foot patrol on Main Street and extra officers will be patrolling the surrounding areas. We reached out to other agencies for assistance, and the Delaware Division of Alcohol Tobacco Enforcement will be sending additional manpower these weekends.

On March 1st, Corporal Zappaterrini responded to Thorn Lane to meet with the owner of a car dealership in Upper Darby, PA. The dealership owner informed Cpl. Zappaterrini that a man from Thorn Lane was arrested by Delaware State Police in possession of a car stolen from his dealership. The man checked Thorn Lane and found another vehicle that was stolen from the dealership on the street. The stolen car was impounded. The dealership owner told Cpl. Zappaterrini that a Dodge Durango that had also been stolen was still missing. Cpl. Zappaterrini conducted further investigation and was able to locate the stolen Durango. A search warrant was obtained for the suspect's apartment and keys to the stolen cars were recovered. An arrest warrant was obtained for the suspect who subsequently turned himself in and confessed to the vehicle thefts.

On March 1st, an elderly woman living in the Nottingham Green neighborhood lost \$1,500 last week after she sent the money to an unknown caller claiming to be her granddaughter. The victim told officers she got a phone call from a female who she thought was her granddaughter, claiming to be in trouble. The caller said she was stopped by Dover Police with two kilos of cocaine in her car and needed to be bailed out of jail. She asked the victim to send her \$1,500 using Reloadit money cards and instructed her to purchase the cards at Safeway in Glasgow. The victim put \$500 on three cards and gave the card numbers to the caller, who then took the money out of her account. The victim said she decided to report the incident to police because the situation "felt off". Officers contacted the woman's granddaughter and confirmed that the call had been a scam. We wish to remind residents to confirm any phone call asking for money or personal information and are asked not to provide any information until the identity of the caller can be confirmed. Residents should ask the caller for a call back phone number, the identity of the caller, and the agency they are calling from. Residents are also advised to tell the caller they will verify the information and then call back.
