

WEEKLY REPORT

Members of the Newark Police Department did an outstanding job of identifying and arresting the suspect in the two abduction attempts on July 4th. Four days after the crime, a press release was issued with the identity of the suspect, and two days later the suspect was in custody. Lt. Scott Rieger, the commander of the Criminal Investigations Bureau, mentioned at roll call how this investigation was truly a department effort. Officers from patrol passed on information and searched for suspects, our detectives worked around the clock following up leads, executing a search warrant and identifying the suspects, and our SWAT Team executed the arrest warrant of the suspect. It was a great job and team effort by members of the police department.

The Chief's Office continues to receive phone calls, emails, and letters, from the public expressing their support of the Newark Police Department. A resident of Winterthur Lane wrote to me and stated of the officers of the police department: "In the midst of the craziness of the past couple of weeks, I wanted to make sure to thank you and recognize all you do for the community. Thank you for serving and protecting me and my family." The letter goes on to state how the resident is praying for our officers and families.

University of Delaware Police Lieutenant Robert "Bobby" Simpson recently retired. He sent a letter to the Chief's Office expressing his appreciation of cooperation and support from the Newark Police Department over the years. Lt. Simpson also wrote: "I respect your officers and truly valued my working relationship with your command staff." We wish Lt. Simpson all the best in his retirement.
