

WEEKLY REPORT

On November 5th, members of the Street Crimes Unit observed two people that appeared suspicious by looking into motor vehicles. The officers arrested the two after they entered a car on Ray Street. One of the suspects was charged with tampering with a motor vehicle. As always, the police department advised the parties involved not to leave valuables in their vehicles and to lock the door when the vehicle is left unattended.

The final session of the Citizen's Police Academy was held on October 8th. During this session, the class outlined the duties of the SWAT Team. At the conclusion of the program, all of the participants were presented with a graduation certificate and congratulated by Chief Tiernan and the Deputy Chiefs. Congratulations to Lt. Hargrove who oversaw each class session. The course evaluation sheets ranked the academy program as excellent. On a scale of "1-5", one of the participants provided a "10" for the rating.

On November 9th, members of the Special Operations Unit participated in a meeting with local businesses in regard to the homeless population. After the meeting, the owners of one of the restaurants approached Lt. Nelson to thank him for the department's efforts to address crime and quality of life issues near an area motel.

In response to an increase in criminal activity, newly promoted Lt. Rubin conducted an officer productivity audit spanning from 2013 to present. Lt. Rubin found that while criminal activity has increased this year, officer productivity has also increased over the past few years. Our officers have been making more contacts in an effort to combat criminal activity. We are now researching the increase in drug activity in the area and its effect on other criminal activity.
